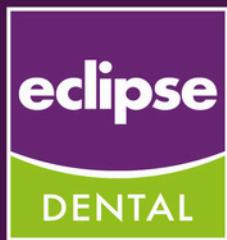


Building Regulations Checklist



This checklist covers the key building and regulatory requirements specific to setting up a new dental practice in the UK.

It's important to consult with local authorities and dental-specific architects or consultants to ensure full compliance with all current UK regulations.

Regulatory Compliance

Planning Permission: Confirm D1 planning consent; obtain permissions for conversions.

Building Control Approval: Apply under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005; ensure compliance with building regulations including accessibility and fire safety.

CQC Registration: Complete the registration process including the required inspections.

GDC Registration: Verify registration of all dental professionals with the General Dental Council.

Facility Specifications

Waste Management: Set up clinical and non-clinical waste disposal systems in compliance with regulations.

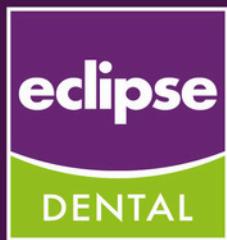
Water and Electrical Systems: Ensure installations like backflow prevention and electrical safety meet UK standards.

X-ray Equipment and Safety: Install lead lining and safety measures for x-ray rooms.

Disabled Access: Provide DDA-compliant access and facilities.

Decontamination Facilities: Properly design decontamination rooms with necessary zoning and airflow.
